

Learn More About St. Joseph's Indian School!

- Opened in 1927 by Priests of the Sacred Heart (SCJs).
- St. Joseph's serves Native American children from South Dakota reservations and neighboring states.
- Boys and girls in grades 1-12 live on campus in 20 family living units.
- Students attending are enrolled by a parent, family member or guardian.
- Each student has a family service counselor. Classrooms have a 12:1 student-teacher ratio; homes have a 6:1 student-adult ratio.
- Lakota (Sioux) children are instructed in their traditions, culture and language.
- St. Joseph's is not government-funded; all programs and services are provided through private contributions.
- About 49% of our students are Catholic; 25% are Episcopal, and 14% are other religions.
